New Vision is the only provider of these vital services for this population in this geographic area. New Vision for Independence is committed to excellence in providing rehabilitation, community education, advocacy, and support services for people with low vision or blindness, and their families to promote independence, acceptance, and self-confidence.

Tab 9. Purchase and Sale Agreement with Fox Run HOA of Tavares, Inc. for .25 Acres of City Property

Mr. Fitzgerald made the following presentation:

The City of Tavares owns approximately 66.0 acres of property located west of Captain Haynes Rd., south of Dead River Rd., and south of the Fox Run subdivision. Fox Run HOA of Tavares Inc. has submitted a letter requesting to purchase approximately 0.25 acres of the City-owned property located adjacent to the Fox Run subdivision.

Fox Run HOA makes this request so that the subdivision may secure a path for ingress and egress from the Fox Run subdivision to 13.0 acres of property owned by the Fox Run HOA located southeast of the subdivision, abutting Captain Haynes Road.

The City Attorney has drafted a Purchase and Sale Agreement for the sale of the property. The proposed sale price for Council consideration is in the amount of \$1,000.

If the City Council accepts the request, Fox Run HOA, Inc. shall be responsible for hiring a surveyor at the HOA's expense to have the 0.25 acres surveyed to obtain a proper legal description of the property. Fox Run HOA, Inc. shall also provide a Quitclaim Deed to the City Attorney for review and approval prior to closing.

The City Attorney has opined that under State Statute and the City Charter it is legal for the City to sell real property based on an un-solicited offer without conducting a request for proposals (RFP) process.

Mayor Pfister asked for comments from the Council.

Vice Mayor Price asked how the City determined the property's value at \$1,000. Mr. Drury said discussions were held by the City Attorney, City Administrator, and Council on whether to go through a costly appraisal process. He noted it was a small parcel the City did not need. The applicant would pay for all recording costs, a survey, and other associated fees. Mr. Drury noted the property was underwater and not of value and felt \$1,000 would be fair and equitable for the staff and Board's time to process the request.

MOTION

Amanda Boggus moved to approve, seconded by Sandy Gamble. The motion carried unanimously 5-0.

Mr. Drury recommended the Council continue with the Regular meeting until the Budget Hearing scheduled at 5:05 p.m.

Mr. Drury said the Chamber of Commerce was holding its annual Business of the Year Gala on September 16, 2022, at Mission Inn Resort and Club, Howey in the Hills. He said the event honors Tavares businesses.

Chief Keith said a Patriots Day memorial event would be held on Sunday, September 11, 2022, in the Lake County Historic Courthouse, in honor of the victims of 9/11. Mr. Drury thanked Chief Keith for his leadership role in the county-wide event.

Mr. Aldrich said the fall Babe Ruth baseball and softball season had begun with a record number of participants at 141 players. He thanked the Council for their support in helping build the program. Mr. Aldrich noted the following new programs being implemented:

- Start Smart Development Program for children aged two to five years old designed to help develop young athletes.
- Take a Hike Program for seniors who walk from Wooton Park to the Ingraham Center and back, with a small function held at the Ingraham Center.

Ms. Roberts read the following Resolution in its entirety:

RESOLUTION 2022 - 16

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A FINAL MILLAGE RATE OF 6.6950 FOR THE CITY OF TAVARES, FLORIDA, FOR AD VALOREM TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023; SETTING FORTH THE PERCENT BY WHICH THE MILLAGE RATE IS GREATER THAN THE "ROLLED-BACK" RATE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAVARES, FLORIDA:

WHEREAS, the City of Tavares of Lake County, Florida on September 7, 2022, adopted the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year Tentative Millage Rate following a public hearing as required by Florida Statute 200.065.

WHEREAS, the City of Tavares of Lake County, Florida, following due public notice as required by law, held a second public hearing on September 21, 2022, as required by Florida Statute 200.065 on the 2022-2023 Millage Rate; and

WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Lake County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the City of Tavares as \$1,310,071,607.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Tavares of Lake County, Florida, that:

- 1. The City of Tavares Fiscal Year 2022-2023 operating millage rate to be levied is hereby set at 6.6950 mills, which millage rate is greater than the rolled back rate of 6.1098 mills by 9.58%.**
- 2. The voted debt service millage rate is set at .2074 mills for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.**
- 3. This Resolution will take effect immediately upon its adoption.**

PASSED AND RESOLVED this 21st day of September 2022 by the City Council of the City of Tavares, Florida.

Mr. Drury made the following presentation:

The City Administrator and staff have developed a budget for Fiscal Year 2023 for Council's consideration totaling \$53,131,518 that is fully balanced. The proposed budget for FY 2023 includes, among many other items, the following:

- 1. Similar Level of Service.*
- 2. Decreased the General Fund millage rate for the 4th year in a row from 6.7579 to 6.6950 (which is 9.58% above the rollbacked rate).*
- 3. Debt Service millage rate decrease (from .2391 to .2074).*
- 4. Increased reserve appropriations to meet the GFOA recommendations for a city of this size.*
- 5. Fire Assessment level funded (no rate increase).*
- 6. Employee raises of 5.38%.*
- 7. Two new Police Officers, and one new Police Evidence Technician.*
- 8. Street paving \$430,000.*
- 9. Expanded programs are cut.*

Previously, the City Council discussed the proposed Fiscal Year 2023 Budget at the following public meetings:

- 7/06/2022 – City Council Budget Workshop – (General Fund Budget)*

On September 24, 2022, in response to an increased threat of risk to the Florida Peninsula from Tropical Storm 9/Hurricane Ian, Ron DeSantis, Governor of Florida, issued Executive Order 22-219 expanding his Executive Order stating that because weather conditions were projected to constitute a major disaster, the Governor declared that a state of emergency exists in the State of Florida.

Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, Emergency Management provides for Local Emergencies; and Lake County was included under a State of Emergency by Governor DeSantis Executive Order Number 22-219.

Resolution 2022-18A sets forth a Local Emergency Declaration, and provides a request to Governor DeSantis to arrange and deliver recovery and response activities as may be necessary and available to aid the citizens of the City of Tavares, Lake County, Florida during and after the emergency.

Resolution 2022-18A is effective retroactively from September 26, 2022.

SUBJECT TITLE: Lake Economic Area Development Partnership (Economic Development)

OBJECTIVE:

SUMMARY:

During the annual budget development process Council requested the LEAD program be brought back to Council for a discussion and decision on funding, deliverables and updates for the Council for the ensuing year.

Attached is the LEAD proposal (Exhibit A) and LEAD Budgetary request (Exhibit B). The Lake 100 group is spearheading this effort with Lake County's economic development department, Elevate Lake. Lake County will be providing the bulk of the funding (\$500,000) to fund LEAD with cities contributing \$1 per capita. Lake County cities will have two representatives on the LEAD Board (One Large City - Tavares) and one Small City.

This public/private partnership as constituted, with a regionally focused approach, can provide opportunities that can leverage and extend Tavares economic development reach, particularly in the area of business recruitment to areas Tavares presently has limited capabilities to capture with the city's limited resources. The city has had and continues to have great success in economic development locally within the City developing a very balanced, broad-based, and diverse business climate within the City. The city had great success in recruiting/ retention, and expansion of its local companies (Sea Ray Aircraft, Jones Brothers, The Big House, Advent Health Waterman Hospital, Osprey Lodge, Atwater Apartments and Sunday Cool to name just a few) however, with a staff of one, dedicated to these efforts (on top of managing a department including Seaplane Base/Marina, Pavilion, CRA, and Special Event Operations) the City's capabilities to reach out farther and do the "big game hunting" necessary to effectively recruit the larger higher wage producing companies to relocate/expand into the Tavares community is limited. To extend the city's present reach would require additional staff and/or consultant partners at a much greater cost.

The cost to hire additional in-house staff and/or consultant partner(s) would far exceed the proposed cost of \$19,000 to the City (likely by a factor of 4 to 5 times this amount \$70,000 to \$90,000). Leveraging the County's \$500,000 with the city's \$19,000 would benefit Tavares. At present the \$19,000 is budgeted.

An opportunity is present to discuss:

1. If the Council wants to fund and support participation in LEAD?
2. If the Council wants the City Administrator to be the representative for the Large City category or someone else?

If the City decides to fund and support LEAD, quarterly reports will be provided to the City Council on deliverables achieved or not achieved.
